### Autumn/Winter weather and coughs and sneezes....

The common cold may be caused by any of over 100 known cold viruses. The common cold spread is when an infected person talks, coughs or sneezes and small droplets containing infectious agents get released into the air. The droplets in the air may be breathed in by those nearby. The common cold is also spread by indirect contact with hands, tissues or other articles soiled by nose and throat discharges. Symptoms include: runny nose, sneezing, coughing, mild sore throat, watery eyes, feeling unwell. From about 1 day before symptoms begin and for the first 5 days of the illness, the common cold can be spread very easily.

At Waikerie Primary School we encourage students to use hand sanitizer, wash hands and to cover their nose and mouth when sneezing, to try to discourage the spread of a cold.

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# Rainbow Citrus Cake Recipe

*Recipe By:*HILARY2000. "Tri-colored cake with a lemon layer, lime layer and an orange layer. The filling is a lemon curd and the frosting is orange.

Prep 45m Cook 30m Ready In 2 h 45 m

## Ingredients

- 3 1/2 cups plain flour
- 5 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup shortening (Copha)
- 2 1/4 cups white sugar
- 4 eggs, room temperature
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
  
- 2 teaspoons grated lemon zest
- 2 teaspoons grated orange zest
- 2 teaspoons grated lime zest
- 2 drops yellow food colouring
- 2 drops orange food colouring
- 2 drops green food colouring
- 1 recipe Lemon Custard Filling
- 1 recipe Orange Cream Frosting

## Directions

1. Preheat oven to 175 degrees C (350 degrees F). Grease and flour three 22cm (9-inch pans). Sift together the flour, baking powder, and salt. Set aside.
2. In a large bowl, cream together the shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs one at a time, mixing until each egg is incorporated; stir in the vanilla. Beat in the flour mixture alternately with the milk. Divide batter into 3 bowls.
3. In the first bowl, stir in lemon zest and yellow food coloring; pour into prepared pan. In the second bowl, stir in orange zest and orange food coloring; pour into second prepared pan. In the last bowl, stir in the lime zest and green food coloring; pour into third prepared pan.
4. Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the centre of each cake layer comes out clean, about 30 minutes. Let cool in pan for 5 minutes, then turn out onto a wire rack and cool completely.
5. Assemble the cake: stack the layers together with the Lemon Filling in between the layers. Frost sides and top with Orange Cream Frosting. Refrigerate until serving.
