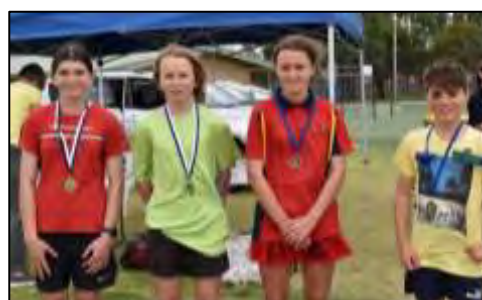
This is the end of another busy term and I wish all students a well-deserved break, however there is still lots of learning to take place in term four.
