








Our Student Free Day was a valuable time for teachers to look deeply into reading and strategies to support reading skills and development of reading fluency and comprehension.



A note from Waikerie Primary School Governing Council – WOOSHC Before School Care

We wish to inform families that the WOOSHC <u>Before</u> School Care, 7am-8.30am, will not continue to be available after the end of Term 2, July 7th. The WPS Governing Council trialled the WOOSHC <u>Before</u> School Care in 2022 to see if it would be a viable service in response to interest we had from families. Despite not meeting the Before School Care booking numbers we had hoped for in 2022, it was decided by School Governing Council to continue to run Before School Care until the end

of Term 2, 2023, with efforts to increase bookings. Despite these efforts we continue to not reach the required <u>Before</u> School Care numbers. Therefore our <u>Before</u> School Care will not continue after July 7th 2023. School Governing Council have put much consideration into this decision and we thank those families who accessed and supported the Before School service since it began. Governing Council remains committed to acting on feedback from our school community and are happy to consider other improvements suggested to us in the future (including another trial of Before School Care if there is increased interest).
