

Free Cyber – safety workshop for parents and carers.

This workshop, facilitated by 'Families growing together' provides current information about cyber-safety to support parents to keep their children safe as they navigate with their child through today's digital technologies. Please be reminded that medication cannot be administered in an education or care service without a written medication agreement (with the exception of emergency medication for anaphylaxis and asthma). This includes panadol/paracetamol and ibuprofen. A registered health professional (ie medical consultant, specialist nurse, GP, Dentist) <u>must</u> complete the 'Agreement' section for any Controlled Drug (S8) (including morphine, dexamphetamine and codeine) or where pain relievers (paracetamol or ibuprofen) are required to be administered regularly or for more than 72 hours. Book Week - This term we will be celebrating Book Week in *week* 5 from the $21^{st} - 25^{th}$ of August. Book week has been running since 1945 and is a week to celebrate books and Australian Children's

authors and illustrators. Mrs Seabrook has been busy preparing the library and activities for our students in preparation for next week. There will be a dress up on **Friday the 25th of August** where students can dress up to the theme of *'Read, Grow Inspire'* or as their favourite book character. Students will be involved in the parade which will be held at 9:00am on the turf, parents are welcome to attend.





Remember the <u>Premier's Reading Challenge</u> continues with books to be read by September 8th, the end of Week 7. It is open to all students from Reception to year 6.

Students are required to read **12 books** and record the titles and authors of the books they read on the Student Reading Record. This needs to be 8 books from the Premier's Reading Challenge booklist at an appropriate literacy level. They may also read 4 books of their own choice at a

similar standard to titles featured on the booklist. This year there is also a special challenge for students who read 20 books instead of the 12 and they will receive an extra certificate to celebrate the 20th Year of the PRC. A teacher, librarian, parent or carer must sign each entry on the Student Reading Record to indicate that the student has read (or shared in the reading of) a book at an appropriate literacy level. Last year we had 126 students participating. An amazing effort. Ask your child's teacher for more information or a reading record if you need one. Let's get Reading!!

SAPSASA Basketball – On Friday the 4th of August, some of our year 5 and 6 students represented our school by participating in the SAPSASA Basketball carnival held in Loxton. Students competed against schools from all across the Riverland. Congratulations to all our students for showing great sportsmanship, teamwork and representing Waikerie Primary School with pride.
