A reminder that the WPS and Department for Education's **Student Use Of Mobile Phones and Personal Devices Policy** requires all students at all department schools to keep personal devices 'off and away' between the start and end of each school day, and while they are attending school activities offsite, such as camps and excursions.

The phone or device needs to be handed into the office at the beginning of the day and collected by the student at the end of the day, or when being signed out by a parent/carer. 
- People are respectful 96% agree/strongly agree

The Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT) are a reading and maths test that students sit online annually. This is a form of assessment that teachers use to support knowing where students are at and what their next steps might be. The tests run for 45 minutes

and students results are immediate once they have completed the test. This allows staff to support students in receiving immediate feedback and teachers to plan learning intentions based on whole



class and individual results. This year we collected data from Year 2-6 and had 82% of year 3-6 students reach the educational standard Reading and 84% in maths. We were pleased with these results and can continue to put strategies in place to further increase our results in the future.
